East Hampton, NY 11937 • www.HamptonsObservatory.org Through November 22: While we've missed the peak of the Orionid Meteor Shower, the show is still going on.

November 3rd through December 3rd: The **Leonid Meteor Shower** is a strong shower, sometimes reaching 100+ meteors per hour. It will peak overnight November 1-18 when the moon will be 23% full. Meteors from this shower are from comet 55P/Tempel-Tuttle.

November 19th - December 24th: The Geminid Meteor Shower is perhaps the strongest of the year and its meteors can be seen before midnight as well as after. It will peak on December 13th - 14th when the moon will be only 1% full.

Thursday, November 30, 7pm, renown meteorologist, Joe Rao, will give a free, virtual talk and answer your questions about the relationship between astronomy, climate and weather. 


