What kind of entertainment kept the summer boarders busy?

May 6, 1881 – Last week the guests of the Shady Point House made the tranquil waters of the creek echo with the splash of oars in the excitement of a boat race.

The ladies of the house rowed for a very handsome silk umbrella The race was over a 3-8 mile course and was won by Miss Cassidy in 1:55.

The gentlemen rowed for a basket of champagne, which was won by Mr. Davidson in 1:42. The race was closely watched by a large crowd on shore and in boats on the creek. It was an informal affair, but afforded much amusement to our summer guests.



Sept. 7, 1883 - A grand tub race was rowed on the creek last Friday by the Shady Point guests; ... the tub race was a most laughable affair, and was heartily enjoyed by quite a crowd of spectators.

FROM THE SUMMER RESORTS, MATTITUCK

On the evening of last Friday a euchre party, followed by a hop was celebrated at Shady Point House. The party was given by the guests of Shady Point and the Ingleside hous-



es in honor of William H. Cotte, who was to leave the next day and who has been responsible for much of the enjoyment during the past few weeks. The broad porch upon which the card tables were set out were brightly lit by dozens of Japanese candles and decorated with many tiny American flags. Between the dances an impromptu program was given. Songs and recitations were rendered to an enthusiastic audience. Miss Julia Kelly sang and Mrs. Cotte and Mr. Wells did an excellent cake walk. ~ The Brooklyn Eagle, August 8, 1901

Mattituck had much to offer, and summer visitors loved their outings here. There was good swimming in the creek, bay, and sound; there were sunburn and blisters to take back home; there were the Literary Society meetings at Library Hall for those who liked entertainment and dancing; baseball games every Saturday; stores to shop in where they delighted in telling merchants they could buy the same goods in A & S nine cents cheaper. Bicycle riding remained popular, with bicycle paths constructed back to Riverhead or out to Cutchogue.

There was a rush for souvenir postcards immediately after arrival to send back to folks in the big city; and there were twice daily trips to the Post Office, morning and 8 P.M. to wait for the mail to be sorted, and to meet friends while the mail was being processed.

Too, the visiting boys liked the local girls and the visiting girls liked the local boys. It was a nice life. A week or two vacation for most; a month or all summer for the prosperous.






