The ever-changing

Greenport's Front Street.

This March 1961 easterly view shows a busy village (especially for that time of year). The famous Mitchell's Restaurant burned down in the late 1970s and is now Mitchell Park. You can see the building that is now Aldo's, with a sign identifying it as a bowling alley. Further east is Paradise Sweets ("SODA" sign) plus a few more that are still standing, with the last being the Mills Building. Note the coin-eating parking meters that lined both Front and Main. Streets.

f you think about it, Greenport has always been the quintessential American village. The uniqueness that follows quintessential is explained by the total Americana values it exhibits now and through the years. For example...

Where else would you find a village on the waterfront that boasts a view of Shelter Island and has a ferry terminal and a LIRR terminal separated by a Maritime Museum and Railroad Museum. How about a movie theater, a hospital and a turn-style railroad track to turn the engine around. There's miniature golf (that once had duck pin bowling and a game room). Add to that boat builders and a 350 ton railway for hauling large boats, Polo grounds, a water tower and a miniature railroad.

Greenport had a drive-in movie theater, an opera house, a red light district (at one time), several bowling alleys, brick yards (Sanford and Sage), an ice plant and its own police department complete with a jail. There were places to go to on the Long Island Sound like Jack's Shack and Clark's Beach. There were restaurants of renown such as Mitchell's, Porky's and Claudios. Many remember the stench of the bunker boat fleets when the boats were at the docks.





#### **US Flag Code:**

"The flag, when it is in such condition that it is no longer a fitting emblem for display, should be destroyed in a dignified way, preferably by burning"

#### Did you know.....

When a flag is flown at half-staff it should be first hoisted to the peak for an instant and then lowered to the half-staff position (one-half the distance between the top and bottom of the staff). The flag should be again raised to the peak before it is lowered for the day.




