





#### PAPER QUILLING CLASS WEDNESDAY, APRIL 10





#### TWO PASSOVER SEDERS FRIDAY & SATURDAY APRIL 19 & 20

Members of Congregation Tifereth Israel, their guests, and visitors to the North Fork are invited to participate in the synagogue's Passover Seders, held traditionally on the first and second nights of the eight-day holiday. Rabbi Gadi Capela, spiritual leader of the synagogue, will lead the Seder service on both nights, in the community room of the synagogue in Greenport, beginning at 6pm.

This year, the first Passover Seder falls on the Christian holiday of Good Friday. In essence, while Christians are remembering the crucifixion of Jesus, Jews will be participating in the Seder ceremony. This concurrence adds significance for some observers of both faiths. The night before Jesus was crucified, his last meal was a Seder.

The Seder follows an order of service prescribed in a special prayer book, called a haggadah, which tells the story, explains the symbols, addresses the issue of slavery, reflects on the beauty of freedom, and expresses gratitude to God for life's many blessings. Among the symbolic foods served at the Seder is a mixture called haroset, made from chopped apples, nuts, wine and spices, which symbolizes the mortar that the Jewish slaves made for bricks in Egypt. Matza is served as a reminder of the hastily prepared unrisen bread made by the Jews as they fled from Egypt across the desert. A roasted lamb bone is a reminder of the sacrifice that spared the Jewish children from God's plague. Salt water represents tears, and horseradish the bitterness of slavery, but parsley and eggs symbolize rebirth.

The dinner will feature traditional foods associated with the holiday, such as chicken soup with matza balls, homemade gefilte fish, roasted brisket, potato pudding, and fruit and nut desserts. The cost is \$60 per person, no charge for children 12 and under. Reservations are required. Please call Elaine Goldman at 631-765-3504 ASAP to reserve a place at the Seder table. #### NEW BOATING REGULATIONS: COURSE BEGINS WEDNESAY MAY 1

The United States Power Squadrons will present "America's Boating Course®" (ABC), beginning at 6:30pm at the First Presbyterian Church, 53100 Rt 25, Southold. ABC is approved by NY State and is the finest course available for boaters to comply with the NY state boater education law\*, as it provides essential information for new boaters or a great brush up for experienced boaters. The course is also approved by the National Association of State Boating Law Administrators and the U.S. Coast Guard.

The 5 sessions (continues 5/8, 5/15, 5/22 & 5/29) will cover boating law, safety equipment, safe boating practices, navigation, boating emergencies, personal watercraft, charts, GPS, trailering and much more. Attendees will receive a 244 page America's Boating Course manual, and after passing an exam, a completion certificate. Many insurance companies offer discounts to boaters who earn their completion certificate. The \$50 fee covers the cost of the manual. Students must be at least 10 years of age on or before May 29th. \* The new NY law requires operators of mechanically propelled vessels in NY waters (who must be over 10 years old), born on or after 1 May 1996 to be holders of a boating safety certificate. Exemptions include: minors between 10 and 18 must have a certificate unless accompanied by an adult certificate holder, new boat owners within a 120 day grace period, boating safety instructors, US Power Squadron members, USCGA members, licensed captains, or on duty emergency service, rescue and law enforcement personnel.




