


Here is the A&P (c. 1930) and, on the left, is the alleyway or passage way that still remains south of the present Love Lane Kitchen.



being up on huge beams about to be moved somewhere. Finally, Barker's Drug Store was a staple of Love Lane for decades. It even included a small soda fountain with a number of stools. How did they fit it all in?

Returning to our starting point at the station, it is of interest to note that the center of Mattituck was over one mile east before the coming of the railroad in the early 1840's. But for all the changes over the past decades, the center would still be recognizable to a time traveler from the 1950's. But one thing is for sure, the flavor of this rural center has moved decidedly upmarket!






