
#### **ARTIST DEMONSTRATION SATURDAY AUGUST 11**



According to a an ad in the February 24th, 1955 issue of the Long Island Traveller Watchman the business was located at 313 South St, opposite the municipal parking lot. This would be the current location of the IGA. The business moved to Southold in December of 1955. — Adam Kaelin



I just saw the June copy of The Peconic Bay Shopper. On page 5 there is a photo of the U.S. Post Office at the site of the former Goubeaud Home Appliances. That was my father Charles Goubeaud's building and yes it is now the site of IGA. It was a thrill to see the photo. Thanks. — Ann Goubeaud Fox

Goubeaud's Home Appliances was located where the IGA is now. The door in your photograph faced 1st Street. My father's store was previously located diagonally across the street, on the northeast corner of First and South Streets. He shared this space with Terry's Bike Shop. Google Maps indicates Triangle Sea Sales is there now.


