On the Cover-

The first verifiable druggist in the hamlet of Southold was Henry G. Howell. (see facing page). According to Rosalind Case Newell's book *Rose Remembers*, H.G. Howell's Drug Store and Home was built on the south side of the Main Road in 1882. In 1903 he was succeeded by Millard Golder (*in the doorway of the*

cover photo). In 1924 the building was purchased by David Rothman.

Incidentally, Millard Golder's son Bill became a pharmacist and was in business with Donald Scott on the other side of the Main Road at the Southold Pharmacy.





The Oil House at Horton Point Lighthouse (seen to the left) was originally built in 1891 as a metal corrugated building used to store lantern oil for the light. The building was flattened by the 1938 hurricane. The cement and gravel base were all that remained for 60 years. In 1998, the Southold Historical Society built a structure on the original slab. Today, it houses the **Tale of the Whale** exhibit featuring whale fossils, humpback whale songs, and facts about whales. The exhibit is open on Saturdays and Sundays through September 22.


