

I haven't provided a great deal of information about the Faulkners or the history of Benesta Lodge, but this did give me an opportunity to reflect upon the five or six years I spent there as a kid. Yes, it was a simpler time. No Internet, no Instagram, no TikTok, no Facebook, no nothing! Just chickens, tractors, peas, praying mantises, poison ivy, chestnuts, bonfires, cow milking, hay lofts, Gangbusters and The Shadow, not to mention games like Tag, Hide and Seek, Mother May I, Red Rover, and Spud. Yeah, it was a simpler time. It was a great time and a great place to grow up. Living at Benesta Lodge was fun! ADE


MARITIME PHOTOGRAPHS (VH) A fascinating view of maritime vessel photographs—all with storied connections to Oysterponds. Sections will be devoted to naval vessels; five-masted schooners; and the side-wheeler steamboats that brought visitors to Orient. **RELIABLE SOURCES: Documents from the OHS Archives** (VH) Sheds light on day-to-day life in East Marion and Orient over a period of several hundred years. Focus will be on some of the most compelling items in OHS's distinguished collection.

RECENT ACQUISITIONS (VH) in the OHS collection include a 1808 "Porter Contract Clock" made by renowned Connecticut clock maker Eli Terry, a shoemaker's bench that came from Orient's Hommel House, a large silver spoon made by the Pelletreau family, the leading LI silversmiths of the late 18th and early 19th centuries, a large mounted collection of East Marion and Orient post cards and much more.

FIREFIGHTING IN OYSTERPONDS (VH) A fascinating overview of the Orient and East Marion fire departments features engrossing related material such as old photographs; documents; medals; old fire buckets; firefighting uniforms, and much more.

AN ORIENT GARDEN (VH) This exhibition, curated by Charles Dean, presents the 38-year history of Village Lane's Adsworthy Garden, begun by Skip Wachsberger, and details its various transformations with photos of the garden, paintings inspired by the garden, and other materials related to Skip's gardening interests.

ART EXHIBITION: Darlene Charneco August 28 – October 24 (SH), For its 2021 Road Show, Water Mill, NY's Parrish Art Museum has invited mixed-media artist Darlene Charneco to create a site-specific exhibition, Symbiosome Schoolhouse, at OHS's Old Point Schoolhouse. 

Exhibit sponsored by the Jewish Historical Society of Long Island. Curated by Brad Kolodny. Opening Reception/Meet the Curator: Thursday, August 12, 6-8 pm. Free to members; \$5/non-member. Includes light refreshments. Brad Kolodny set out to document and photograph every synagogue that has ever existed in Nassau and Suffolk, and four years later he completed that task, having photographed 385 buildings that at one time were, or currently are, being used as a synagogue. This exhibit showcases a sampling of Kolodny's images based on their historic significance, architectural design, and other attributes. Together, the images tell the story of Judaism's evolution on LI—from the humble beginnings of the first synagogue built in 1896 and the massive growth following World War II to today.
