

## Orient's Five Tiny Tuthills

Not dwarfs but "little people". Orient's midgets preferred to be called little people. Dwarfs have bodies out of proportion. For example, a normal torso with tiny legs or something of that nature. But little people are just that — little people. They're properly proportioned. They are just small.

Oysterponds Historical Society (OHS) in Orient has information along with portraits, photographs, furniture and memorabilia of the village's smallest but most famous residents...the FIVE TINY TUTHILLS.

The Tuthills are among the East End's oldest families. John T. Tuthill settled in Southold in 1640. A descendant, Rufus T. Tuthill of Orient, married Lucinda Griffing, and together they had seven children. Three girls, Cynthia (1797-1881), Lucretia (1808-1888) and Asenath (1809-1875), were midgets, with normal human proportions but of sub-normal size. All their lives they were affectionately called "the small sisters". (*The OHS has no photos of them.*)

Their normal brother, Peter, married Laura Terry, and they had four children. Two daughters, Rosalie and Lucinda, were normal size. Two were tiny — a daughter Emma (1840-1888) and a son Addison (1841-1894).

It was estimated that Cynthia, Lucretia and Asenath were around three feet tall. Addison and Emma, however were considerably shorter than their aunts, each measuring less than thirty inches. That's nearly a full foot shorter than the world famous General Tom Thumb who was forty inches!

P.T. Barnum, the World's Greatest Showman, tried to persuade Addison with a lucrative offer to join Thumb (in actuality Charles Sherwood Stratton of Bridgeport, Connecticut) in his famous troupe of midgets in





"The greatest Show on Earth". Addison, however, didn't want to be stared at like a curiosity or picked up like a child. Choosing instead to live a normal life with support of the family and friends in his hometown, he refused Barnum. (Reports of a fist fight between Tom Thumb and Addison Tuthill at their first meeting are unsubstantiated and were probably an exaggeration.) It is reported that Barnum, fearing he had offended the lilliputian Tuthill, sent him a carved cane as an apology.

Orient's tiny people made their living as expert knitters and dressmakers for the community (standing on chairs to fit their customers). Even Addison, who first lived at the Point and did chores with scaled down farm tools before moving to the village, learned to knot and mend.

It was inevitable that many such stories about the little persons should enter into the oral history of the community. Several bear repeating:

- Lucy Tuthill Luce, a descendant, said around 1940: "I can remember the small sisters and used to visit them. Aunt Cynthia was the head dress-maker; great talkers they were one would tell the other to stop talking because she wanted to say something. I shall never forget it." Apparently the constant talking was a trademark of the diminutive clan, because a number of other residents of he era recalled the tiny Tuthills chattering incessantly as they walked single file down Village Lane.
- Being shy, retiring, "and less than a yard tall," recalled niece Lucy Tuthill Luce in an interview, "Addison and Emma would often resort to the quiet haven under the table when callers arrived. There, in seclusion, hidden by the drape of the tablecloth, with their games of checkers or parcheesi, their bibles, or perhaps their knitting or sewing, they would remain for sometimes hours, unseen and unheard."
- Cousin Ethel Tuthill (Rackett) related an incident which may have in-

fluenced Addison's decision to say no to P.T. Barnum. It was certainly one of life's most embarrassing moments for him, and it happened when Addison was taken to call at the home of a relative, Aunt Ella Caswell Brown.

"Along the back ran a dark passage under the eaves through which my aunt was walking. She met a small figure and picked him up, tossed him above her head saying 'What's your name?"

"Addison," he said...and he was much older than Aunt Ella."

None of the five ever married, but all lived to be comparatively old for midgets. Cyntia was 83, Lucretia was 80, Asenath was 65, Emma was 48 and Addison was 52. After the death of their sister Asenath and their aged father, their brother Peter built Cynthia and Lucretia a house on Village Lane 400 feet south of the monument at the intersection with Route 25. It had small windows and doors with low knobs and other conveniences to suit their stature. Emma and Addison eventually moved in too. The house still stands but the low windows and door were replaced.

# The B. C. Tuthill Store, East Marion

Take a walk through some of the cemeteries on the North Fork and you will likely find many tombstones bearing the Tuthill name.

Benjamin C Tuthill, a distant relation to Orient's "Tiny Tuthills" owned Tuthill's General Storein East Marion. This beautiful building stood on the north side of the Main Road across from Bay Avenue.

In 1934 or '35 owner B. C. Tuthill rented the general store to a Mr. Vuhn, who after dismal sales, organized a "Going Out of Business" auction. Since the school was merely five doors down, Principal Morton allowed the children to experience the auction.

Young Doug Rogers, however, then a 5th grader, was told he needed to stay put and catch up on a subject he was doing poorly in. This would not do as far as Doug was concerned, and he sneaked out and managed to purchase a sweater at the aution!

In later years the East Marion Gun Club met on ther first floor of the gable.

Falling to disrepair, the building was razed.







That reading grew into Heritage Day, an annual celebration where the Oysterponds community (comprised of East Marion and Orient, NY) comes together to celebrate this great country of ours and, especially, Oysterponds.

Regrettably, an in-person Heritage Day is just not possible this year. 




