
#### **US Flag Code**:

"The flag, when it is in such condition that it is no longer a fitting emblem for display, should be destroyed in a dignified way, preferably by burning"

#### Did you know.....

When a flag is flown at half-staff it should be first hoisted to the peak for an instant and then lowered to the half-staff position (one-half the distance between the top and bottom of the staff). The flag should be again raised to the peak before it is lowered for the day.






