

On the Cover-

The then-recent constructed Southold Savings Bank, seen in this 1895 view, shows a group of people seemingly practicing their own social distancing!

The president of the bank, Howard Hunnting, is seen standing on the sidewalk to the left. Note the bars on the windows. The Cochran home is to the left.

The building, now the home of the Southold Free library (see ad below) was built in 1891. It is said to be in Richardsonian Romanesque style.

In 1925, Southold Savings Bank moved their business to the larger building on the corner of the Main Road and Youngs Avenue. The old building was purchased by Edna Cahoon Booth, whose family had been residents of Southold since 1900. Ms. Booth subsequesntly donated it to the Southold Library as a memorial to her parents, Edward and Georgianna Cahoon, both of Southold. The Town then donated \$1104.00 toward renovations and the Cahoon Memorial Building opened its quarters as the Southold Free Library on December 15, 1928.

The Southold Academy

Discovery of photos and records found in the cleaning and reorganizing during the COVID-19 pandemic brings the history to life again. The following pair of stories about the Southold Academy's beginning and subsequent academic alterations show a contrast in comparison of curriculums. The F.E.S story (author unidentified) was found in our old records. Becky Terry's story was published in the *Peconic Bay Shopper* in 1979.

Academy Nosíalgia

The Movement for an Academy in Southold was started by Dr. Epher Whitaker in 1866. Mr. Henry Huntting and Capt. Theron Worth each pledged \$1000 if the sum could reach \$5000. In excess of that sum was given "to establish a good school of high scholarship and Christian morals, "the house to be erected under the direction of Mr. B.H. Booth, Henry Huntting, Esq. and Rev. Whitaker. The buildings and other properties were to be held by the First Church Trustees without any sectarian hindrance to the training of the pupils. The lot on Hortons Lane was purchased from Capt. Ira Tuthill, It was the eastern half of the home lot of Barnabas Horton and several schools had stood upon it. The academy opened its new building Dec. 18, 1867, the announcement as follows:



The new Academy at Southold is now open for the reception of pupils who are twelve years old and upwards; and the attendance of all such is respectfully invited. Unusual attractions are offered to young gentlemen and ladies who wish to pursue either English, Classical, Scientific or Mathematical studies. Careful attention will be given to Reading and Elocution. Terms -- \$25 per year, or \$7 per quarter. No additional charges for higher studies. Good board can be had in the village for four dollars per week.

Historian Clarence A. Wood describes an Academy baccalaureate service at the Presbyterian Church in June 1895. Three graduates, Henry Elmer, Henry Payne and Theodore Shipherd were honored and demonstrated their fine training. Recitations in English, German, Latin and Greek plus a cornet solo and a trio made up the program. Language study at the Academy was advanced by novel methods. Those students studying French often visited the Great Western Mill at Pine Neck to converse with Rene Villefeu, the mill operator, in his native language.


In 1907 the first class of 1886 held a reunion. One lady, Annie Smith, had married the first teacher, Elbert Cummings. At age 20 this young man, little older than some of his pupils, had left Hamilton College to earn money enough to finish his education. Dr. Whitaker described him as "strong, alert and full of merriment to overflowing." Much reminiscing went on in the old Academy building as former students exchanged news and gossip. Ettie Payne's popcorn was declared to be just as tasty as ever; Carrie Huntting's apples just as delicious, not to mention Mattie Wells' molasses cookies and pot cheese. The occasion was one of many such reunions to be held before the doors of the Academy closed in 1938, later to be reopened as a printing shop.








SOUTHOLD ACADEMY — Visted by F.E.S. May 9, 1923

F.E.S. left New York Tuesday, May 8 at 3:49pm and arrived at Greenport at 6:40, spending the night in the Wyandack hotel. In Greenport he inquired concerning Southold Academy and found that little was known concerning that same.

Wednesday morning he visited Southold and called upon the Reverend William Lloyd, Pastor of the Southold church, who took him to the Academy, which occupies one small frame building on a lot containing 1½ acres close beside the railroad and one block away from the main street. Miss Allen, a graduate of the Blowing Green Business College, Blowing Green, Kentucky, is in charge of the school this year in the absence of Miss Bethel, the regular teacher, who has a leave of absence because of the illness of her mother. Miss Bethel expects to return next year. The largest enrollment any time during the present year in the school has been 26. At the time of the visit by F. E. S. there were 16 enrolled and 11 were in attendance, 1 boy and 10 girls. The school offers business courses in typewriting, stenography, etc. as shown on the leaflet on page 8. There are four terms of ten weeks each and the tuition is \$7.50 per term. The tuition must be kept below the tuition charged in the high schools at Greenport and in Riverhead Long Island where they have commercial courses.

Most of the students come from outside of Southold commuting daily and using either the bus that runs between Greenport and Riverhead or the trains.

The school is run most economically but is insufficiently equipped. They have only four typewriters that can be operated and should at least have enough to supply half the pupils with machines so the adequate opportunity for practise can be furnished to the students. The space in the building also could be better arranged and more room given to the typewriters which are in one small room.

The Board of Trustees of the Church control the institution and direct its affairs, the pastor Mr. Lloyd of his own volition, has nothing to do with the management of the school. The pastor before him had to leave after a short stay chiefly because of over interference in the management of the Academy. The Academy seems to fill a small need in the eastern end of Long Island in as much as there is no business school elsewhere and only commercial courses in the two high schools at Greenport and Riverhead to which all that desire a business training cannot go.

Mr. A.T. Dickerson, the cashier of the Southold Bank, is one of the Trustees of the Church and the Treasurer of the Trustees of the Academy, and the chief man in connection with the management of the Academy. He was absent from Southold and in attendance upon the wedding of his niece at Port Jefferson on the day of the visit of F.E.S. Mr. Lloyd took F.E.S. in his automobile about the country and to call upon Mr. Lehr, a farmer, and president of the Board of Trustees. The Trustees run the institution year by year without going into debt and are very deeply interested in the maintenance of the Academy which originally was conducted as an old fashioned Academy, but, with the advent of high schools, had to give place to the re-organization along its present lines. While it continues to supply an educational need of the community as it seems to do at present, it has a definite place and work to do.

The Presbyterian Church at Southold was organized in 1640 and the present building is over 100 years old. In addition to the fine old building with a steeple and a clock there is a parish house and Sunday school room crossing the Main Street and a fine large manse in splendid repair next to the church. The village cemetery lies all about the church.

F.E.S. returned to New York Wednesday afternoon.

CAST

Community Action Southold Town, Inc. (CAST), a non-profit organization helping underserved populations in the Town of Southold since 1965, has been on the front lines, supporting Long Islanders since Suffolk County's first case of coronavirus was reported in Southold Town on March 9. CAST is experiencing an unprecedented demand for food and other emergency assistance. Bank of America, CAST's lead and steadfast supporter, has responded with a grant to help meet the tremendous need on the North Fork. CAST has customized their services and adjusted hours and procedures to ensure the safety and wellbeing of clients, volunteers and staff during this challenging time:

- 1. **Food Pantry** is open Monday 9am-12pm, Tuesday 3pm-6pm, Friday 9am-12pm. Distribution of pantry bags will be at the back door.
- 2. Emergency Feed-A-Kid Program while schools are closed. Families in need can get a Feed-A-Kid bag once each week at one of CAST's satellite locations: First Presbyterian Church in Southold or Holy Trinity Episcopal Church in Greenport during Food Pantry hours. 
