

A dark apparition appears in the transportation room, the shuffling sounds of furniture being moved are heard in the grand hallway, the sound of a woman weeping comes out of nowhere... Come visit...if you dare! For over 130 years, ghost stories have swirled around our museum. With curious artifacts ranging from coffins, Victorian-era murder weapons, and wreaths of human hair, to stories of undocumented human bones found in the collection, the Museum has had no shortage of eccentric artifacts that stir the darker imagination.
