Southold's AWS Volunteers



Two of Southold's observation posts were the Southold High School's cupola and the Horton Point Light House.

At these posts the volunteers were trained specifically to identify all aircraft sighted, be it U.S., British, German, Japanese or Italian. When a plane did fly over, a report was immediately filled out to record direction, number of engines, approximate altitude and finally the type of plane. The observer would then phone the operator with the key words "ARMY FLASH" for a quick connect to the Army Tracking Station to relay the information.





During WWII, the east and west coasts of the United States were protected by civilian volunteer aircraft spotters, a component of the Aircraft Warning Service (AWS) that was established in May 1941 in response to the development of heavy bomber aircraft capable of flying over 1,000 miles.

Since it wasn't practical to use military personnel as ground observers, the logical solution was to call on civilians to watch the skies. Newspaper ads, radio programs, and other means were used to recruit the tens of thousands of volunteers needed to join the Ground Observer Corps and man the observation posts. From all walks of life, all ages, all professions, the volunteers were united in a common goal—to protect the United States.



While the ground observers were the eyes of the AWS, the nerve center was the Aircraft Warning Corps. The AWC was made up of information and filter centers based in secret locations. These centers, also manned by volunteers, received reports from the observation posts and plotted and tracked aircraft aerial activity. Aircraft spotters learned to identify all types of aircraft through intensive training classes and train-




