TO ALL VOLUNTLINS OF THE AIRCRAFT WARNING SERVICE:

You have had a unique opportunity to see and to take part in the gradual transition from the defensive position into which your country was forced at the start of the war to the offensive that is today forcing our examise back towards Berlin and Toklo. Many of you have served Loyally and well in the Aircraft Warming Service ever since December 8, 1961. All of you have con-Aircraft Warming Service to making this transition from retreat to advance possible.

The most crucial battles of our Sation's history are now in prospect overses. They demand the full resources of our country, both in marpower and material. For that reason, the War Department has directed the further reduction of air defense measures within the continental United States and the release to the offensive of trained soldiers and equipment that could not otherwise be brought to bear upon the energy.

The aircraft saming centers, at which so many of you have served and to which so many others have reported as ground observers, are to be closed. The Aircraft Warning Service, on a reduced scale, will be aborbed into in-stallations used for the training of fighter pilots. The resulting savings in military personnel and equipment will be substantial.

This does not mean that the War Department is of the opinion that all danger of energy boobing has passed. On the contrary, a small-scale smeak raid is still within the capabilities of our energies. We must win this war in Europe and Asis, however, and the calculated risk we are assuming in re-iducing our air defense measures is justified by the offensive power we will there by release.

During your period of duty with the Aircraft Warming Service, you have learned many facts which, if made public, might be of service to the energy. The Kar Department looks to you to maintain silence with respect to these matters of mational security. The obligation you assumed to safeguard mili-tary information remains in full effect.

This war has a long way to go. We are only just entering upon its crucial phase and victory lies far ahead beyond many bloody battles. The War Department sincerely hopes that you will not relax your war effort, and urges that you transfer to one of the many remaining vitally important jobs the legalty and self-sacrifice you have ahown in your work for the Aircraft Warning Service.

The Mar Department is deeply grateful for the important service you have rendered your country.

You have done a splendid job and have successfully accomplished your particular mission which must now be terminated because of the de-velopments of our strategic situation. Now with the war almost entirely in its effensive phase, I hope and believe that you will turn your patriatic efforts into other forms of work which will belp to support the attack and bring the day of victory mearer.

As an indication of the appreciation of this command, and in recog-nition of your faithful performance of duty as a member of the Aircraft Marning Service, you will receive in the near future the I Fighter Com-mand Certificate of Homorable Service.

I want to thank each of you for all you have done. Tour country, the Army Air Forces, and your fellow Americans owe a debt of gratitude to the amabers of the Aircraft Harning Service.
