Tuesday, February 11, "Montauk Point Lighthouse" by Henry Osmer, 4pm in the Peconic Landing Auditorium, 1500 Brecknock Rd. Greenport. Southold Historical Society is pleased to be partnering with Peconic Landing to continue the Winter Lectures Series which is themed Long Island Landmarks.

Henry Osmer is the definitive historian of Montauk Point Lighthouse. He has worked at the Montauk Point Lighthouse since 2001, becoming historian in 2009. He has published five books about various Montauk subjects, including the Lighthouse. His presentation will cover perhaps the most notable and most beloved Long Island Landmark. As the oldest lighthouse in New York State, Montauk Point Lighthouse was authorized by the Second Congress, under President George Washington, in 1792. Construction began on June 7, 1796, and was completed on November 5, 1796. Montauk Point Light has provided safe passage for thousands and thousands of ships and for millions and millions of people and still serves as a navigational tool today.

February 29: The Apprenticeship of Duddy Kravitz

This comedy-drama features Richard Dreyfuss as a brash, restless, young Jewish man growing up poor in Montreal. Duddy's father and uncle are very proud of Duddy's older brother Lenny who is in medical school. Only his grandfather shows the motherless Duddy any attention. A summer job changes Duddy's life.

March 28: Enemies, A Love Story

Based on the novel by Isaac Bashevis Singer, this film deals with the lives of Jewish survivors of the Holocaust, who find it difficult to abide by religious morals and question a God who could let the Holocaust occur. Ron Silver plays a character who leads a double (or triple?) life, married to his wartime protector (Lena Olin) and fooling around with a married Jewish woman. Things get more complicated when his first wife (Angelica Huston), thought dead in the Holocaust, returns.

April 25: A Woman's Pale Blue Handwriting

It is Austria 1936, and Leonidas Tachezy, an Austrian government official happily married to the daughter of a prominent family, receives an unsettling letter. Twelve years before, as a student in Germany, he had an affair with a Jewish woman. Now she is asking for his help in placing a half-Jewish eleven year old boy in an Austrian school. The ethical crisis: is the child his? Should he help, and at a time when the Nazis are on the rise?
